Peace, grace, and hope to you!

You will be reading this edition of the Partnership Magazine, about the time Advent begins. So, on one hand, yes – all those Christmas decorations you have been seeing in the shops, now start to have more sense.

I want to take this opportunity to share some thoughts with you on the Christmas story of "then" and its amazing connection with "now". The House Group I am part of has been using Searching from Home (Advent reflections on the God who welcomes everyone). This is a York Course, and it has really got us talking and connection matters in an extremely exciting way. There are four chapters, and when I write this, we are just halfway through, and it has proved to be a wonderful journey. The titles of each meeting: Leaving home, Fleeing home, Carrying home, Finding Home. And it as certainly helped us think of what Mary, Joseph and Jesus went through.

The sharing of the House Group has helped us grasp the relevance of the story of "then" to the current times, our "now". Joseph receiving the call to go from Nazareth, where he was living with Mary, to go to Bethlehem, to where the baby was to be born. Heavily pregnant, sitting on the back (the hard back) of donkey, and Joseph walking beside her- off they go. Whether it was a long or short journey is irrelevant. It was a time where common sense suggested they stay where they were. But no...and when they get there, where to stay? Not a vacant place available. Finally, a stable is offered. Think for a moment is that is what you would like for your loved one to be at the time of giving birth a first child?

And some time later, after the visit of the Magi the call to leave, in a hurry to Egypt because the life of the child was in danger. The political authority was after all children 2 years and less. Leave at night...what to take? No room for this, no space for that? Throw something into the bag and run...run, not just round the corner, but to Egypt. Remember Pharaoh and Moses, and the rush to leave Egypt. Well, now it is going back to Egypt to be able to live. Of course, we have learnt the lesson, we would not repeat such horror, would we?

And we realized that this IS the story of so many people today. Running to safety, to a foreign place, where there is no room, where they are not wanted. Taking nothing with them. For how long? God only knows. Why? Why? Why? The haunting question. People leaving in a hurry, taking nothing, risking everything because it is dangerous to stay where they are. Crossing land and sea to "safety". Really?

And we understand the Christmas Story in the light of our today...Joseph, Mary, Jesus were asylum seekers, refugees, persecuted. Their life was in danger. Dear God, that is horrible. Dear God, that is wrong. Jesus, the saviour born into risk. And yet, that story is being repeated today. How many persecuted? How many fleeing? How many refugees? How many living in tents? How many suffering hostility? God this continues to be horrible. God this continues to be wrong.

What Joseph, Mary and Jesus experienced is more complicated than what a Christmas Carol can communicate; more troublesome than what a Christmas Card can depict.

As we approach Christmas, I thank God for The Harbour, for Amnesty International, for Christian Aid, for Threshold, for Night Shelter, for the Food Bank, for MSF and Doctors of the World...and so many organizations helping those who today suffer; may our lives be open to the needs of others, may we see the troubles of today in the light of the troubles of the past and through the Love of God be truly welcoming, loving, kind and filled with a passion for justice. May the Joy of the birth of the Saviour be the announcement of life for all people.

I close with the words of The Peace Carol – sung by The Muppets and John Denver.

The garment of life, be it tattered and torn The cloak of the soldier is withered and worn But what child is this that was poverty-born The peace of Christmas Day.

Add all the grief that people may bear Total the strife and the troubles and care Put them in columns and leave them right there The peace of Christmas Day

The branch that bears the bright holly The dove that rests in yonder tree The light that shines for all to see The peace of Christmas Day.

MY SABBATICAL

In the previous issue of the Partnership Magazine, I shared some thoughts on my Sabbatical, focusing on Symbols, this month I would like to take one more step along the way and share thoughts on Silence.

My pastoral experience has shown that on the whole, most of our churches don't like silence too much as part of a service. A short little time is fine, but it has to be short. If the silence is a bit longer, people become uncomfortable, even fidgety and impatient. But so often only silence will allow us to reflect, to come closer to the depth of our feelings and be open to God's words. And then again, we don't really like noise either. So how do we balance moments in our lives?

During my Sabbatical, I visited a number of art museums, and a number of temples – mostly Christian, but again, in Prague a number of synagogues. And suddenly I realised that there was more silence in an art museum, standing in front of wonderful paintings, than there was in a church or a cathedral, also with lots of art around. And I got thinking about it.

Add to this that for about 6 Sundays around my Sabbatical, when I was in Swindon, I chose to attend the Sunday Meeting of the Society of Friends, better known as The Quakers, when the worship times is about one whole hour of silence, sometimes someone is moved by the Spirit to say something for the edification of the people, will speak.

And true, the first couple of times it was "different" to so say the least, but then, one Sunday that silence was filled with meaning, with deep communication, and I came away feeling I had really "heard" what I needed to. And can those of you who know me, imagine me in silence for a whole hour ()

Silence can be a time of profound communication. When in prayer we are given the chance of more than five seconds of silence as a token of something different...when we have the time to go deep inside ourselves to bring to God what otherwise we would not do. Time to reflect, time to respond, time to understand what has just happened. Time to be nurtured – as the Psalmist says: "Be still and know that I am God" (Ps 46; 10)

And what can I say when I come face to face with an amazing painting, in which the artist lets us grasp a time, a feeling, a situation that no words can express. This happened to me a number of times – When in El Prado Museum I stood in front of Hieronymus Bosch Garden of the Earthly Delights; and when at the Reina Sofia I was overwhelmed by Picasso's Guernica, and in Prague when I walked through the Jewish Cemetery and found a grave from 1498, and in Berlin when I visited Zion Church where Dietrich Bonhoeffer had been minister back in 1932 ... or in Leipzig, visiting St Thomas Church, where Bach was composer for so many years, and the only sound was an organist playing the same organ Bach had played and, and was responded to by the new massive organ, in a church where there was no human voice heard, as all were listening to the music, or in Colmar when I stood face to face with Matthias Grunewald's Isenhein Altarpiece. probably one of the most sublime paintings I have ever seen...those are places and moments when no words can communicate, only silence. Deep, moving silence.

Silence is not always absence, as you can find in those special moments in prayer when questions you don't even know are there, find a way forward. Or when you have read something in the Bible and in the silence that follows, you "hear" something you have not heard before. And the fact that during the travel time of my Sabbatical I was on my own, there were many times of silence, which contributed to good times of refection, and a further appreciation on the importance of silence, in a world where there is so much noise going on.

If there is any group which would like me to share some of the Powerpoints I have prepared on my Sabbatical, just let me know. I'd love to share with you.



WELCOME TO THE NEW BISHOP OF SWINDON



We are delighted to share the exciting news that The Venerable Neil Warwick has now been consecrated as the new Bishop of Swindon.

The consecration of the Bishop of Swindon took place on Thursday, 30th November at Canterbury Cathedral, with the Archbishop of Canterbury presiding over this momentous occasion.

Neil will succeed the Rt Revd Dr. Lee Rayfield, who retired earlier this year, bringing a fresh perspective and renewed energy to the diocese.

Neil has been a prominent figure in the Diocese of Bristol, serving as Archdeacon of Bristol since 2019. In this capacity, he oversaw three thriving deaneries within the vibrant and diverse city of Bristol. His dedicated service as part of the Bishop of Bristol's leadership team played a pivotal role in the formation and implementation of the diocese's mission plan, "Transforming Church Together."

Hailing from Surrey, Neil's journey of faith and service has been both diverse and inspiring. He initially pursued a degree in geography at Nottingham University before venturing into the transport industry and overseas development with World Vision. It was during his time with World Vision, and his experiences with the communities they serve, that his faith was profoundly deepened. Neil's commitment to community development and leadership led him to complete an MBA at Eastern University, Pennsylvania.

In the year 2000, while on a trip to Zambia, Neil felt a divine calling to priesthood. This pivotal moment marked the beginning of his journey toward ordination, and after training at Ridley Hall, Cambridge, he was ordained in 2005 at Peterborough Cathedral. His initial ministry took root during his curacy in the market town of Towcester.

In 2009, Neil assumed the role of Vicar at St Nicolas Earley, a bustling suburban church. Over the years, he also served as the Assistant Area Dean for Reading for five years. Most notably, Neil was a valuable member of the Archbishop's Racism Taskforce, contributing to the creation of "From Lament to Action," reflecting his unwavering passion for fighting injustice.

Neil's vision and enthusiasm for his new role as the Bishop of Swindon are palpable. He is eager to embody the diocese values of openness, creativity, generosity, and bravery as he serves the churches and communities in Swindon and North Wiltshire. He is devoted to supporting Swindon's churches in their mission to foster community, establish local partnerships, and be a positive presence in town and beyond.

The heart of his vision lies in the power of the Church of England as a steadfast presence in every local community. With a particular focus on schools and chaplaincies, he envisions a significant force for Gospel change. Neil's deep commitment to these ideals, combined with his faith and joy, promises to be a source of blessing to the diocese.

I have reached out to Neil as part of Christ Church's mission of supporting the Bishop of Swindon and their families. This support includes practical and spiritual assistance, a tradition Christ Church has maintained in the past with Bishops Michael Doe and Bishop Lee. We will continue our support when Bishop Neil relocates to Swindon at the beginning of next year. Neil is married to Helen and has two grown-up children. He loves collecting jazz on vinyl, going to gigs, and shouting at Nottingham Forest games! So we should get on very well.

Neil says "I'm delighted at the prospect of being the Bishop of Swindon, in a Diocese I love and at an exciting time in its life."

Furthermore, it is a great privilege for Christ Church to host Bishop Neil's diocesan Welcome service on Sunday, 3rd December at 6:30 pm.

The Old Town Partnership choir will lead the worship, and the church's bell ringers will ring before the service. Additionally, the church will organize the practical arrangements and a reception in the Community Centre afterward.

We eagerly anticipate the arrival of Bishop Neil and look forward to the continued growth and transformation of our diocese under his leadership.

Please join us in praying for Neil as he takes on this new role, that he may faithfully and joyfully serve the communities of Swindon and North Wiltshire, guided by the help of God.



I positively have the scaffolding up, I have a lot of work to do, bridges to mend and some to rebuild. For the first time in my life, I have a sound foundation to build my life upon.

You are all part of that foundation held together by God's mercy. I am eternally grateful to God and to all of you. My unwavering faith in God and gratitude for my Christ church family, blesses me everyday, sharing The Good News and serving others in love, with compassion. Developing a personal relationship with God and Jesus Christ through prayer, meditation, worship, and pilgrimage.

Gathering together for Fellowship of Faith and seeing the sharing of faith, food, fun, family, feelings and firsts. Serving stew and dumplings at Fellowship of Faith Harvest gathering, watching my family gathered round a table sharing stories and life, seeing children running around playing amongst the adults engaging with them, the smell of the church, the sound of the music and voices all blending together.

That's my life now as a Christian, saved and born again, a life in the light with community, family, friends, support, help, hugs, high fives, and love. The Holy Spirit, who fills me with purpose and wisdom, I know I'm never alone walking with Jesus Christ and feeling God's Grace always in the good times and in the dark times.

Swindon Humanitarian Aid Partnership Update



In last months article, I mentioned the offer of huge numbers of hospital beds and mattresses from a source in Yorkshire.

In the last month SHAP volunteers and Ukrainian trucks have collected around 250 hospital mattresses from a Yorkshire village called Shelf. Most were then sent on their way, along with dozens of hospital beds to various hospitals and charities in Ukraine. The remaining mattress and beds will be loaded and sent to Ukraine this week.

All at SHAP were proud and honoured to receive a visit from The Lord Lieutenant of Wiltshire, Mrs Sarah Troughton.

We have existing plans to convert a bus donated by Go East Anglia Bus Company into a Children's Story Bus and we hope there may be some well known children's champions involved in the handover of the bus to the people of Ukraine. Discussions continue!

Finally we believe SHAP is doing a pretty good job getting aid into Ukraine, supporting Ukrainians in Swindon and representing our town in the wider world

With modest funding we could do so much more, but the £millions controlled by the Disaster Emergency Committee in London are only available to the big 10 charities. Can any of them match our economic efficiency-1500 tonnes of aid delivered for £18000. I doubt it. SHAPs work is undertaken entirely by volunteers.

We have written to politicians from all parties asking them if there is any pressure they can exert to give little players like SHAP the opportunity to compete for funds held by the DEC. When the public so generously donated to the fund I don't think they were aware of the restrictive rules so we hope fairness will prevail.

SWINDON LIONS MESSAGE IN A BOTTLE

The Lions Message in a Bottle scheme is a simple but effective way for the elderly and vulnerable people to keep their basic personal and medical details where they can be found in an emergency, on a standard form and in a common location – the fridge.



TThe scheme works as follows. A small white and green bottle is supplied which contains a pre-printed form and two green cross stickers. The user fills in the form, puts the completed form, with a photograph if possible, in the bottle and puts the bottle in the fridge. One of the stickers is put on the fridge door, and the other one is stuck on the inside of the front door. If there is more than one relevant person in the house, then they should all complete a form each and put them in the same bottle.

In an emergency the presence of the stickers will alert the emergency service to the presence of the patient's details in the fridge, which could be essential in any treatment given at the house or at the Hospital.

This scheme was adopted as an official project by Lions Clubs in 2004 and today more than 7 million green topped bottles have been distributed across the British Isles. Lions Clubs promotes this scheme because we believe that it gives elderly and vulnerable people more confidence about their treatment in an emergency. It also gives peace of mind to relatives that essential information will be available in an emergency situation. It also helps the emergency services in a potentially difficult situation.

As a former emergency worker I wholeheartedly endorse this scheme. If you require a bottle, the Parish Office at Christ Church have some. If you would like one but cannot collect it, or you would like more information, please contact me – Lion Rod Davis, Lions Club of Swindon, telephone 01793 723314.
